Sepulveda Basin Wildlife Areas Steering Committee Meeting May 25, 2021 — Approved Minutes

Government Agencies:

Tessa Charnofsky: Sheila Kuehl's office is supporting workshop about invasive shot hole borer 6pm June 16. — link will be sent to Nurit.

Linda Babcock, Army Corps of Engineers: 6/26 cleanup of So Reserve, Creek in good shape due to volunteer work, a priority. Morning only. Bird survey before to be sure no nesting birds are disturbed.

Jon Rishi, ACOE: USGS survey of turtles found no western pond turtles, mostly red-eared sliders. 2 other species. He found a fish die off in LAR near dam: dead and dying carp. No other species. He filed reports. No detected pollutant. The turtles trapped have been donated to Natural History Museum.

Sofia Aleman, Mountains Recreation and Conservation Authority (MRCA) participated mostly to learn about Sepulveda Basin. Their Ranger Division is still in charge of the recreation zone along the river. Walt Young still with MRCA. There will be kayaking again this year.

Jonah Glickman, CD-6: He is excited for cleanups in the basin every Saturday in June. Office still working with unhorsed in the basin. No updates on masterplan but it is part of the city budget. The motion to develop a new master plan is 20-1205. Not finalized. Homeless will not be removed during the cleanups; only loose trash will be removed.

Member Reports:

CNPS weeding this Saturday morning. They witnessed an arson fire at the archery range last Sat. Frequent coyote sightings.

SFVAS walks. Creek cleanup 6/19. Mark observed a dead oak close to Wildlife Way just west of Haskell Creek was cut down suddenly with no notice. Nesting ongoing there of Nuthatches and Acorn Woodpeckers. Nurit will email Steve Dunlap and Cc Jon Rishi. Perhaps 2 oaks

were removed. Mitigation measures could have been taken short of taking the tree(s) down during nesting. Robert Buenrostro will inquire as well. [Note: we confirmed post meeting that a large black walnut tree with White-breasted Nuthatch and Acorn Woodpecker nests had not been removed, rather a leafless coast live oak (also with reported nests) and a pine. The oak snag was a well known and important habitat tree. It was removed due to safety concerns. Will continue dialogue with LA City regarding approaches to snags, and <u>Army Corps has requested notice of any planned native tree removal whether inside the Wildlife Reserve or anywhere in the basin.</u>]

Joe Phillips: Sierra Club is reopening on July 1.

Pat Bates: Encino NC measure to FoLAR to help with cleanups costs to be discussed tomorrow night. Also a measure to support formation of a Friends of Sepulveda Basin. More community outreach and buy in is needed.

Alex Garay, Encino NC: He wants to do more for the Basin.

Melanie Winter, River Project: Plugging along on feasibility study for river restoration. Two alternatives. One restores just the waterways. The other is bolder. Both will improve flood protection, recreation, circulation, and boating. Something will be ready to show us this summer. Working with Army Corps. Presented to Jonah at council office. She hopes the plans can be integrated with the upcoming master plans.

Ruth Doxsee, Lake Balboa NC: LBNC is meeting June 2.

Valley Changemakers Presentation: Carla Robinson and Ethan Barmache: Brochure Kiosk. Brochures for younger kids, children's book about wildfire. Website. Seed balls, weeding, brochures, Kiosk with QR codes. They would staff it on weekends. They're thinking of installing a kiosk in July. Suggestions and discussions.

<u>A Committee Walkthrough June 22 at 5:30PM</u> instead of a Zoom meeting. Meet at the amphitheater. Nurit will send around email regarding walkthrough.

<u>Future Meetings</u>: Keep online format? Much positive reaction. Not an option to meet in person until city facilities are open. Members support Zoom meetings with occasional walkthroughs.

<u>Next Steps in Weed Management?</u> Climate initiative tie-ins — get CSUN people to take on weed-control projects. Richard Rachman, other CNPS leaders, Nurit, etc. Bill Neill might be paid by city or other funding. Effective for him to oversee volunteers. Map of weeds may be a bigger project than it's worth.

<u>Vice-chair for rest of 2021</u>: (FoLAR possibly next year.). Glenn willing to assist and advise for the rest of the year. He is not necessarily committing to chairing next year. **Motion by Nurit**, **seconded by Muriel Kotin that Glenn serve as vice chair for the rest of 2021 without his committing to chairing next year passed unanimously.**

Public Comments:

In 1904 Blue Oaks were recorded in the Sepulveda Basin. We might consider re-introducing them. Very drought tolerant. Good water table of basin might also help. Engelman oaks are probably not in historical record.

The meeting adjourned at 8:30 PM. Our next meeting will be a walkthrough 6/22 at 5:30.
